Child Find FAQ's

What is child find?

Child Find is a component of Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) that requires districts to identify, locate, and evaluate all children with disabilities, aged birth to 21, who are in need of early intervention or special education services.

What does it cost to have my child evaluated?

The Child Find team at no cost to parents conducts screenings and/or evaluations.

Who can make referrals for a special education evaluation?

Parents and family, teachers, preschool staff, daycare providers, doctors/nurses, social workers, or anyone who works with children between birth and 21 years of age.

Who should I contact if I want to make a referral?

If the child is not yet enrolled in school, contact the Child Find team at the Special Services Building at 970-874-7607. If the child is currently enrolled at a Delta County School, you can make your referral request to the student's classroom teacher, the building principal or the Director of Special Services.
